Lismore - [Southern Cross University - Direct Enroll](#)

Prepare yourself for a career in the 21st century music industry with this course, which will provide opportunities to develop your skills as a musician, while also building your knowledge about the many facets of the music industry. Some possible courses include Creative Music Practice, Sound Production, and Instrumental Techniques.

Udaipur - [Service Learning in India: Interdisciplinary Community Solutions](#)

3 credits for SUST 150. SUST 150 counts toward **Goal Area 10**. It takes place during Summer (12-15 days in May). Students will study sustainability and social justice from an interdisciplinary perspective.

Europe

Czech Republic and Hungary

Budapest, Prague - [Cities of Fairytales: Prague and Budapest](#)

6 credits: ART 313 (3 credits) and ART 398 (3 credits). ART 313 counts toward **Goal Areas 6B and 8**. Takes place during Summer (18-22 days in May/June). Students complete intensive reading, lecture, studio art practice (design, photography, drawing and painting), group discussions, field trips, and art and design projects to learn and understand contemporary European society.

Italy

Florence, Rome, Venice - [Dante In Italy](#)

3 credits for ENG 221 or ENG 432. ENG 221 counts toward **Goal Areas 6A and 8**. Takes place during Summer (18-21 days in May). Students will explore the connection between the culture of Florence, Italy and Dante's Commedia (The Divine Comedy).

Jamaica

Kingston, Treasure Beach - [Child Welfare, Health Systems, and Social Justice in Jamaica](#)

3 credits for NURS 316 or SOCW 316. These courses count toward **Goal Area 8**. Takes place during Winter Break (13-15 days in December/January). Students use a trans-cultural approach to learn about child welfare systems, with an emphasis on human rights, social justice, and health systems in Jamaica and US.

South America

Ecuador

Otavalo - [Civic Engagement with Peoples and the Environment in Ecuador \(summer program\)](#)

6 credits in GS 375. GS 375 counts toward **Goal Areas 9 and 10**. Takes place during Summer (17-20 days in May/June). Students explore ways local events are linked to global processes and ways Natives are implementing "development with identity" on their own terms, by using intercultural strategies, local and hybrid knowledge sets, and local governance.

3 credits for ART 313. ART 313 counts for **Goal Areas 6B and 8**. Takes place during Summer (21-26 days in May/June). Students will study New Zealand art and film, reading New Zealand literature, and exploring how the physical landscape itself so profoundly shaped ideas of what it meant to be from these remote South Pacific islands
